

Conduct NEET to increase PG seats in medicine, MARD urges Central govt

The proposal will address the issues of shortage of doctors in govt hospitals and put an end to the malpractices during admission process

Central Maharashtra Association of Resident Doctors (MARD) has urged the Union Health Minister J P Nadda to increase the number of post-graduate (PG) seats in medicine by conducting National Eligibility-cum Entrance Test (NEET).

MARD claims that the proposal will address the issues of shortage of doctors in government hospitals and put an end to the scam of crores of rupees during admission process in private and deemed universities.

On August 8, 2015, the Supreme Court (SC) of India had given a verdict stat-

ing "if post graduate seats for a certain subject are recognised in a medical college, further increase in the number of post graduate seats in that speciality does not require Medical Council of India (MCI)'s inspection and can be sanctioned by the Central government itself."

When asked, Dr Amit Lomte, vice president of Central MARD, said, "In wake of the SC's verdict, we urge the government to take this point into account which will be a great measure to increase the number of specialists in the country. Currently, the private and deemed universities conduct their own exams and give admission to students

by charging high fees which has turned into nearly of Rs 12,000 crore. If NEET comes into action, there will be a centralised pattern wherein there will be one single exam for all the students."

MARD states that one simple measure of NEET which is also now directed by Supreme Court will bring an end to the malpractices and meritorious students will become specialists which will be beneficial to the healthcare system in the long term. Dr Sagar Mundada, president of Central MARD, said, "If we compare, the PG seats in private hospitals are high as against the government hospitals which faces the issue of shortage of doctors.

Despite of bearing huge load of patients and surgeries, the PG seats are limited in government hospitals and have not been increased in the past years."

When asked, Dr Kishore Taori, member of MCI, said, "The Central MARD's demand is fine but we need to look at all the positives and negatives and ensure that the state doesn't suffer because of this decision. NEET will definitely bring in transparency and there will be a single source for all the exams but we need to wait for the court's verdict. Also, the reason for few seats in government medical colleges is lack of infrastructure and poor educational facilities."

Haryana gangster encounter: Case referred to 3-member bench of SC

The matter of the alleged encounter of Haryana gangster Sandeep Gadolia has been referred to a three-member bench of the Supreme Court after there was a split decision earlier on whether an FIR should be launched against the Haryana encounter team.

Gadolia was reportedly killed by an eight-member encounter team on February 7 in a hotel in Andheri (E) where he was staying with his accomplices. However, his family had refused to claim the body of the gangster saying that this was a case of fake encounter and the body is lying even today in the mortuary of JJ Hospital.

According to Sandeep's brother, Kuldeep Singh, in its recent hearing the two judges of the SC had differing opinions on this issue and hence the matter was referred to a three-member bench. "The hearing on this matter will now take place on May 27 and we hope to get

a favorable judgment from them," he said.

The brother further said that all the necessary forensic evidence in this case points towards the fact that Sandeep was killed in a fake encounter. "The CCTV footage clearly shows that the Haryana policemen shot at Gadolia in cold blood just outside the hotel room and then seeing him writhing in pain on the floor," he said. The footage also shows Sandeep asking the policemen why they shot him when he had given up his criminal ways," Kuldeep said. At the end, the Haryana policemen are seen firing a gun at random and then placing it in the hands of Sandeep after he is dead.

Another crucial piece of evidence is that the hand wash of Gadolia that was sent to forensic laboratory has come out as negative. "This again shows that Sandeep never fired at the policemen, or else the gun powder marks would have been found on his hands," Kuldeep pointed out. All these evidences are enough

for the police to register an FIR against the Haryana Police and take action against them for carrying out a fake encounter.

When asked about this, Avdhoot Chavan, assistant police commissioner, who is heading the Special Investigation Team in this case said that there is no question of registering an FIR when the matter is already in front of the SC. "We will have to wait for the apex court to take a decision on this matter and accordingly we can decide on the future course of action," he added. Responding to the forensic reports, the officer confirmed that they have received them and have asked further queries to the forensic laboratory on this issue.

High profile sex racket busted in Andheri

Three models were rescued and two male pimps arrested after a prostitution racket - operating from a hotel in Andheri - was busted late Monday night.

Acting on a tip off, the Social Service Branch of Mumbai Police immediately swung into action and laid a trap by impersonating as customer.

The SSB officials say the pimp demanded huge money from them to supply models.

"We carried out a raid in Hotel Garden Residency in Andheri (East) and rescued three female models and arrested two male pimps. One of the pimps is hotel staff," said SSB PI Raja Bidkar. He said that one Santro car - in which the models were brought to the hotel - has also been seized.

The senior PI of SSB P. Repale said two more pimps involved in the racket are still absconding and the manhunt is on.

Besides this, various other materials including five mobile phones worth Rs 40,000 have been recovered from their possession.

Prostitution racket still thrive despite police being vigilant in the city. The sex racket is rampant in the areas like Andheri, Bandra, Mira Road and Dahisar, said sources.

The officials - who acted as bogus customer - have recovered the huge money which they had offered pimps for female models, whose are between 25-30 years old.

After registering the case at Borivali police station, the female models have been sent to Makhurd rescue home and both the pimps have been booked u/s 370 (3), 34 IPC and PITA Act.

CORRUPT MCGM STENOGRAPHER GETS PLUM POST IN ULHASNAGAR MC

MUMBAI: In a shocking news of the Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai (MCGM) incorporating corruption, Ganesh Shimpi (35), a stenographer who was caught by the Anti Corruption Bureau of Thane while accepting a bribe of Rs 25,000, is now being awarded as an Assistant Municipal Commissioner in ward number 4 in Ulhasnagar Municipal Corporation (UMC).

Shimpi was caught red-handed by the ACB for accepting a bribe to allow illegal construction on July 5, 2013. Shimpi was given a post despite the UMC found him guilty after they probed into the matter. It should be noted that the inquiry carried out by the retired Deputy Secretary of UMC K S Bodade had asked for strict action against Shimpi.

Also Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis had ordered to remove Shimpi from the post after a local resident wrote to the CM. Shimpi was accompanied with Rizwan Shemle, a peon who took reports of illegal construction.

The duo was then booked under Section 7 (public servant taking gratification) and Section 13 (criminal misconduct by public servant) of the Prevention of Corruption Act.

GRP launches anti-tobacco awareness drive with zeal

The Government Railway Police (GRP) has launched an awareness campaign to say no to tobacco and its officials have been making efforts to convince policemen and rail commuters to give up imbibing tobacco.

For its anti-tobacco awareness drive, the GRP has procured posters from Indian Cancer Society and put them on display at various GRP police stations. The ACP of Kalyan GRP division Sudhir Jambavdekar said the ongoing anti-tobacco drive has covered areas like Kalyan, Dombivali, Karjat, Panvel, Vashi, Thane and Wadala.

In a bid to embolden the drive, the officials of GRP have organised lectures by health experts. This drive has also given an opportunity to several police inspectors to deliver lecture on the hazardous effect of tobacco, said Jambavdekar, who further added that in Wadala a street play was organised.

"At most places public is also being educated through either meetings or street plays or an-

nouncements," he added. Jambavdekar further informed that the anti-tobacco campaign will also cover other major stations like Borivali, Andheri, Bandra, Dadar, etc. to educate people about the toxic effects of hazardous substances like pan-masala, cigarette, gutkha, etc.

Few major stations in Central line are making constant announcements to quit tobacco besides citing the hazardous effects of tobacco use, said Jambavdekar and further informed that such announcements will soon be made at major stations of Western and Harbour lines.

The anti-tobacco drive, which is the brain child of GRP Commissioner Madhukar Pandey, has got a positive response from commuters at large in Central line. One of the commuters Ramesh Shukla said, "I have been chewing tobacco for the last several years despite knowing its aftereffects. I tried giving it up several times but I failed somehow. But the constant announcements and bigger posters were very helpful for me to reduce tobacco use. I hope I will give it up now."

High Court grants relief to seven PMLA accused

On Tuesday, the Bombay High Court granted interim relief to seven of the several accused against whom the special Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) court had issued non-bail able warrants for their alleged role in the Rs 800 crore

money laundering case.

Former deputy chief minister and senior NCP leader Chhagan Bhujbal and his nephew, a former lawmaker, are already in custody for allegedly conspiring the Maharashtra Sadan and Kalina Library scam.

Having entertained their applications, now all the seven busi-

nessmen will not be arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) till May 25.

A single-judge bench of Justice Ajay Gadkari, who was hearing the applications challenging the NBWs granted the relief to Asif Balwa of Balwa group, Jagdish Prasad Purohit, Sanjiv Jain, Praveen Jain, Chandrakant Sar-

da, Rajesh Mistry and Karkaria. The counsels who appeared for these seven businessmen argued that their alleged offences were non-cognizable and also that since the agency did not arrested them during the interrogation, there was no point in issuing a warrant against them at the very first instance.

Poornima Kantharia, the counsel who appeared for ED objected the applications saying that if they are granted with the interim relief, the efforts of the agency may get frustrated.

However, the High Court granted relief to all the seven accused and deferred the matter until May 25.

SC orders review of Jiah Khan's suicide case

The Supreme Court on Tuesday asked the Bombay High Court to re-examine the 2013 suicide case of actress Jiah Khan in view of her mother Rubiya Amin's plea for further probe by a Special Investigation Team (SIT) and her complaint of improper hearing in the trial court in the absence of the special public prosecutor.

The mother knocked at the doors of the Apex Court after the Bombay High Court refused to extend stay on the trial, holding that the CBI investigation ordered by it cannot go on forever. She had claimed anomalies in the findings of the CBI, which had charge-sheeted Jiah's former boyfriend and actor Suraj Pancholi for alleged abetment.

A Bench headed by Chief Justice of India T S Thakur had last Friday ordered hearing on her petition by the vacation Bench of Justices Abhay Manohar Sapre and Ashok Bhushan, who felt it was a fit case for reconsideration. The High Court has fixed next hearing in the matter on June 7.

Jiah Khan, best-known for the film Nishabd, was found hanging in her Juhu apartment on the night of June 3, 2013. The High Court asked the CBI in 2014 to investigate as her mother suspected it to be a cold-



Bombay HC to hear case from June 7

New Delhi/Mumbai: The Bombay High Court will hear the case of actress Jiah Khan's suicide from June 7, following a Supreme Court directive to expedite the matter, her mother Rubiya Khan said on Tuesday.

Rabiya Khan, who moved a plea in the Supreme Court through her lawyer Jayant Bhushan, said that the matter was being heard in an improper manner in the trial court in Mumbai.

bloody murder. Jiah's mother challenged the CBI report categorising her death as suicide and not homicide.

Jiah's case has opened up a lot of secrets about her life. She was dating Sooraj Pancholi, who was arrested by Mumbai police in the case. He is out on bail after cooling heels in custody for 20 days.

Her mother had gone to the High Court when the special public prosecutor preferred not to appear before the trial court in view of disagreement with the CBI who declined to charge Sooraj for aiding suicide under Section 306 of IPC and be tried for murder.

The actor has claimed innocence and denied any role in Jiah's death. Special Public Prosecutor Dinesh Tiwari had reportedly faulted the CBI's charge-sheet for several loopholes.

Sheena Bora case: Custody of all accused extended till June 6

A special CBI court on Tuesday extended the judicial custody of all the four accused in the high profile Sheena Bora case till June 6.

Apart from extending the judicial custody of former media baron Peter Mukherjee, his wife and main accused In-

drani, her second husband Sanjeev Khanna and Mukherjee's former driver Shyamvar Rai who are in custody since last year, the special court also directed CBI which is investigating the case, to respond to the application moved by driver Rai who had in last hearing expressed his desire to become an 'approver' in the case. The agency was expected to file its reply on Tuesday, but it asked for more time to respond to Rai's application. The CBI will now reply on June 6 and inform the court about its opinion on Rai's desire for becoming an approver.

The Mira Bhayandar Municipal Corporation (MBMC) seems to have finally woken up and will try to save reserved land that is falling prey to encroachments in different parts of the twin-city. In a belated move, the MBMC has formed a team of designated civic personnel to keep a hawk's eye on the public utility plots.

It should be noted that out of the 386 plots marked as reserved in the 1997 Draft Development blueprint, 122 have so far being acquired by MBMC's Town Planning wing.

While some of the plots have been partly acquired, the civic administration has managed to develop land tagged reserved for various public utilities, including playgrounds, gardens, social forestation, markets, parking, stadium, hospitals, community halls, gymnasiums and libraries.

Earlier the responsibility was shouldered by officials deputed as ward-in charges of all the six zones of the twin-city. However, alarmed by their failure in protecting the plots, which led to massive encroachments and legal hurdles to get rid of illegalities, civic chief Achyut Hange has deputed a team from the Public Works Department (PWD) including deputy and junior engineers to ensure that the reserved plots are not encroached upon. "To ensure an effective mechanism the newly constituted team has been empowered to register police complaints against encroachers," confirmed Hange.

Sceptical about the success of the newly crafted anti-encroachment plan a high ranking officer attached to the PWD wing said, "Our department is already facing an acute staff crunch. These officers are saddled with existing responsibilities; the new task will further burden their work pressure. I fear if they will be able to live up to the expectations of the civic chief."
